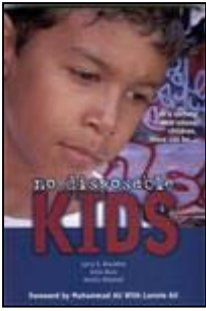

No Disposable Kids by Larry Brendtro, Arlin Ness, Martin Mitchell

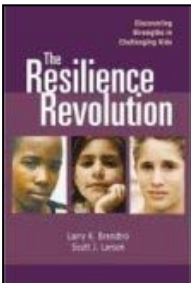
